

## Lockwood entities halt any

## possible construction of 'flood protection'

The Board of Trustees for the Canyon General Improvement District and the Board of Directors for the Rainbow Bend Homeowners' Association have decided to take a step back and put a halt to any possible construction of

flood protection under the direction of the Truckee River Flood Project at this point in time.

This action was taken because CGID Manager Connie Butts and RBHOA Chair Shirley Miller, as well as the Storey County rep-

resentative to the TRFMP, Dennis Miller, have all three decided that after many years of trying to work with the TRFMP, they have not been given sufficient information.

"Why should we destroy our river bank when

they don't even know what they are doing yet?" Butts asked.

"According to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers representatives, it will be another 1 ½ to 2 years before the Corps even know how much water they are send-

ing down and what will be built.

"When they are ready to provide us with accurate information and assurance of protection for our community, we will reconsider and move forward, but not until then," Butts said.
